DR. TONY HEADLEY THRIVING IN MINISTRY

Bio:

Dr. Headley has published five books including Achieving Balance in Ministry, Reframing Your Ministry and Family Crucible: The Influence of Family Dynamics in the Life and Ministry of John Wesley. As demonstrated by these titles, Dr. Headley has a strong interest in ministry issues. Accordingly, over the years, he has conducted seminars on ministry topics such as self-care, stress management, burnout, flourishing in ministry, conflict resolution and other related topics for many churchrelated organizations such as the Church of God in Christ (COGIC), Churches of Christ in Christian Union, The Salvation Army, the United Methodist Church and the Free Methodist Church of North America. For the past four years, he has taught a course titled Flourishing in Ministry for Asbury University. Dr. Headley developed this course which is taught to Salvation Army officers. He has also consulted and done seminars for mission organizations. Additionally, for several years, Dr. Headley has served as a frequent speaker for alumni groups of Asbury Theological Seminary across North America.

Description:

This session will explore various models of leadership ministers bring to ministry and how their personal experiences and other dynamics contribute to their leadership style. While addressing factors that detract from effective leadership, it will focus on those which can promote effectiveness and thriving in ministry. Ministry can contribute to difficulties in one's marriage and family relationships. In this session, the presenter will address the various dynamics that operate in the marriage and families of those called to ministry. Focus will also be given to strategies that promote healthy functioning.

UNDERSTANDING AND
ENGAGING CONTEXT

Bio:

Dr. Emilio Alvarez is one of the up-and-coming scholars and commentators on the intersection of religious education and theology in America. As a ministerial practitioner, his vast experience within the Christian Church world-wide has positioned him as a prophetic voice. especially within Afro/Latino communities of faith. Currently, he serves as the Primate of the Union of Charismatic Orthodox Churches. He is also the founder and Rector of The Cathedral at Gathering Place in the city of Rochester, New York. Bishop Alvarez holds a Bachelors in Christian Education, a Master of Arts in Religious Education from New York Theological Seminary, a Ph.D. in Religious Education from Fordham University in the Bronx, New York and is currently pursuing a second Ph.D. in Divinity at Aberdeen University under the supervision of the Very Rev. Dr. John Behr. Bishop Alvarez has a new book with InterVarsity Press Towards A Pentecostal Orthodoxy (2021) and is also a contributor to the forthcoming IVP liturgical series, The Fullness of Time: A Journey Through the Church Year (2022).

Description:

This session teaches pastors the importance of evaluating the context in which they minister by providing practical tools for understanding people and their values, interests, and practices in their specific area. Pastors will develop specific ways in which they and their community can purposefully live out the gospel in their context.





DR. JAY MOON
ENTREPRENEURSHIP FOR
THE LOCAL CHURCH

Bio:

Jay Moon served 13 years as a missionary with SIM, largely in Ghana, West Africa among the Builsa people focusing on church planting and water development, along with his wife and four children. He is presently a Professor of Evangelism & Church Planting and Director of the Office of Faith, Work, and Economics at Asbury Theological Seminary. He authored four books, including Intercultural Discipleship: Learning from Global Approaches to Spiritual Formation in the Encountering Mission Series by Baker Academic. He also edited four books, including Entrepreneurial Church Planting: Innovative Approaches to Engage the Marketplace. He is a frequent speaker on areas of church planting, evangelism, and marketplace mission. In addition to his role as a teaching pastor in a local church plant, Jay holds a Professional Engineer's license and his MBA focused on social entrepreneurship. His hobbies include tree houses, ax throwing, and small business incubation.

Description:

Discover how entrepreneurs are engaging business and mission for marketplace transformation. This seminar discusses both theory and practice by looking at various case studies of entrepreneurial church planters from contemporary culture as well as historical and biblical examples. If you are asking questions about alternative funding approaches for ministry that engage unchurched or dechurched people, then this seminar is for you.

MAKING DISCIPLES
AND GROWING LEADERS

Bio:

Brian Taylor began working in full-time ministry in 2002, serving as a campus director for Every Nation Campus Ministries on several campuses in Nashville, TN including: Vanderbilt, Tennessee State, and Fisk University. In 2007 Brian and his family moved to Orlando, FL to serve alongside Pastor Tim Johnson in starting Orlando World Outreach Center. After six years in Orlando, with two children and one on the way, Brian and his wife Chavonne moved to Cincinnati to launch Bethel Cincinnati Church as lead pastors. In addition to his work in leading Bethel Cincinnati's multiethnic congregation, Brian also serves as chaplain for the University of Cincinnati football team, and serves on the leadership team for The Mosaix Network. He holds Doctorate of Ministry degree at Asbury Theological Seminary. Chavonne works alongside Brian as he pastors and leads the church. They have three beautiful children, Elijah, Saniya, and Joshua.
